Member Legal Aid Society.</p> <p>A Tiffany silver gilt Presentation Dessert Flatware set was given to him with this plaque: "Presented to Walther Luttgen, by his friends in London Lord Rothschild, Leopold de Rothschild, and Alfred de Rothschild, on the occasion of the Fiftieth Anniversary of his connection with the firm of August Belmont & Company November 19th 1909".</p> <p>According to the book Linden New Jersey, by Lauren Pancurak Yeats, he had an estate at Luttgen Place in Linden. In the 1870's he built a school there called the Academy of Arts and Sciences which later became the Linden Country Club and is now the Moose Hall. He also provided the community with the Amelia Victoria Kindergarten named for his wife. The Linden Library moved to part of the Academy in 1927. He helped purchase Grace Episcopal Church, which had been lost in a sheriff's sale, in 1877 and had it moved to land he donated in 1887.</p> <p>His yacht, the Linta, was taken over by the US Navy in 1917, named SP721, and placed under the command of Worthington Scott, USNRF. It served in WW1 as a patrol and escort boat out of New York accompanying merchant ships, convoys, and submarines. It was decommissioned in 1919 and returned to its owner.</p> <p>Walter also had a power boat, the Lutuhezi, which won a race with the Columbia Yacht Club June 20, 1903</p>
